## Macquarie Investment Funds

### Macquarie Core Hedged Global Shares Fund<sup>1</sup>

This fund update was first made publicly available on: 28 July 2022

#### What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Macquarie Core Hedged Global Shares Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Macquarie Asset Management Public Investments (NZ) Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

#### Description of this funds

The fund invests in shares listed on share markets predominately in developed economies, and is fully hedged to the New Zealand dollar. The portfolio uses multiple managers and is diversified by region, manager and investment approaches.

The fund's exposure to global shares is through investment in the Core Global Shares Fund. The Core Global Shares Fund invests in a diversified portfolio of international shares using a range of investment managers. By actively managing its exposure to each underlying investment manager, the Core Global Shares Fund is able to respond to changes in market themes which can drive share markets.

Environmental, Social and Governance characteristics are integrated into the underlying investment managers' investment processes.

The underlying funds are PIE funds and the majority of these funds hold shares directly.

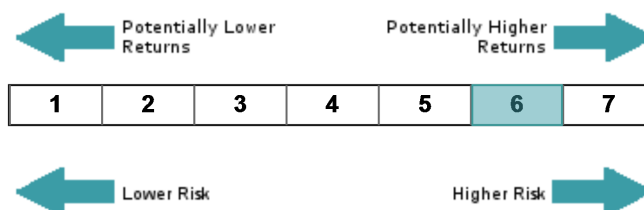
The fund targets a position of being 139% gross hedged to the New Zealand dollar. The hedges are based on the currency components of the underlying index.

The performance objective of the fund is to provide a Gross Return (see note 2 below) above the return of the MSCI World ex Tobacco Index with net dividends reinvested (139% gross hedged to the New Zealand dollar) on a rolling three year basis.

#### What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the Macquarie Core Hedged Global Shares Fund:



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

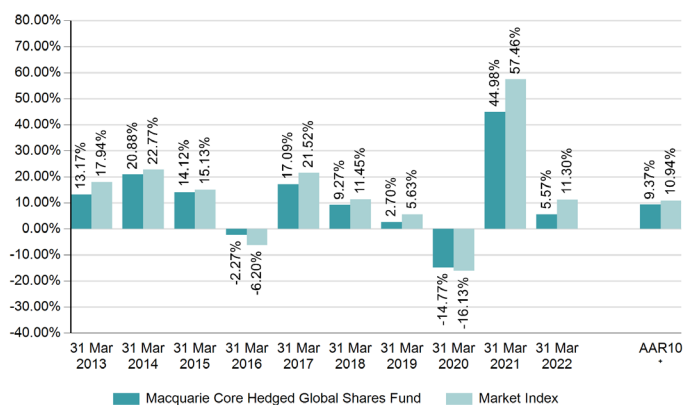

## What fees are investors charged?

Investors in the Macquarie Core Hedged Global Shares Fund are charged fund charges. In the year to 31 March 2022 these were:

\*\* The fund holds units in underlying funds, which pay performance fees to the managers of these underlying funds. In the year to 31 March 2022 the manager of one of these underlying funds paid a performance fee rebate back to the fund. This has resulted in other management and administration charges being negative in this fund update.

\*\*There were no performance fees paid or rebated in underlying funds for the year to 31 March 2022. As at 1 April 2022 there are no longer any performance fee arrangements in underlying funds.

Investors may also be charged individual action fees for specific actions or decisions (for example, for withdrawing from or switching funds). ## Example of how this applies to an investor<sup>5</sup>

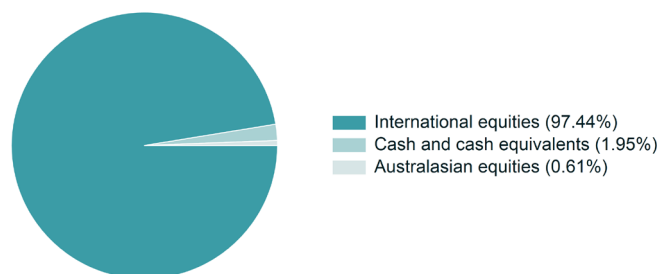
Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

Jeff had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Jeff received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$648 (that is 6.48% of his initial \$10,000). This gives Jeff a total return after tax of \$557 for the year.

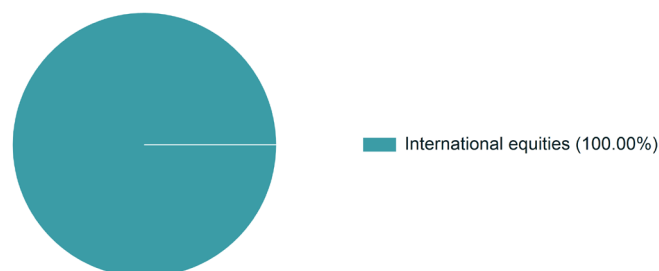

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## Notes

1. In March 2022, Macquarie Asset Management Holdings Pty Limited completed the acquisition of the AMP Capital Global Equities and Fixed Income business from AMP Group Holdings Limited. Prior to that acquisition, Macquarie Asset Management Public Investments (NZ) Limited was known as AMP Investment Management (N.Z.) Limited and the Macquarie Core Hedged Global Shares Fund was known as the AMP Capital Core Hedged Global Shares Fund.
2. Gross Return is the return before the deduction of tax, expenses and fees and assumes all income is reinvested.
3. These returns are for the periods ending 30 June 2022.
4. The bar graph shows fund returns after the deduction of fees and tax, however, the market index returns are shown before any fees or tax are deducted.
5. The returns and tax calculations used in this example are the actual fund returns and tax charges (or rebates) for the year ended 31 March 2022. Net of tax returns can be more than gross of tax returns where, due to the fund's tax position, it receives a tax rebate rather than paying tax.
