Mercer Macquarie Global Listed Infrastructure Fund Mercer Investment Funds

Quarter ending 30 September 2023

This fund update was first made publicly available on: 30 October 2023.

What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Mercer Macquarie Global Listed Infrastructure Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Mercer (N.Z.) Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

The fund invests in infrastructure securities in both developed and emerging markets across a range of sectors. This provides access to a range of infrastructure sectors across geographic regions, with active portfolio management that seeks to target excess returns and predictable, stable cash flows. Environmental, Social and Governance characteristics are integrated into the investment process. The fund aims to provide total returns (income and capital growth) after costs and before tax, above the Dow Jones Brookfield Global Infrastructure Index, fully hedged to New Zealand dollars, on a rolling three-year basis.

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the Mercer Macquarie Global Listed Infrastructure Fund:



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

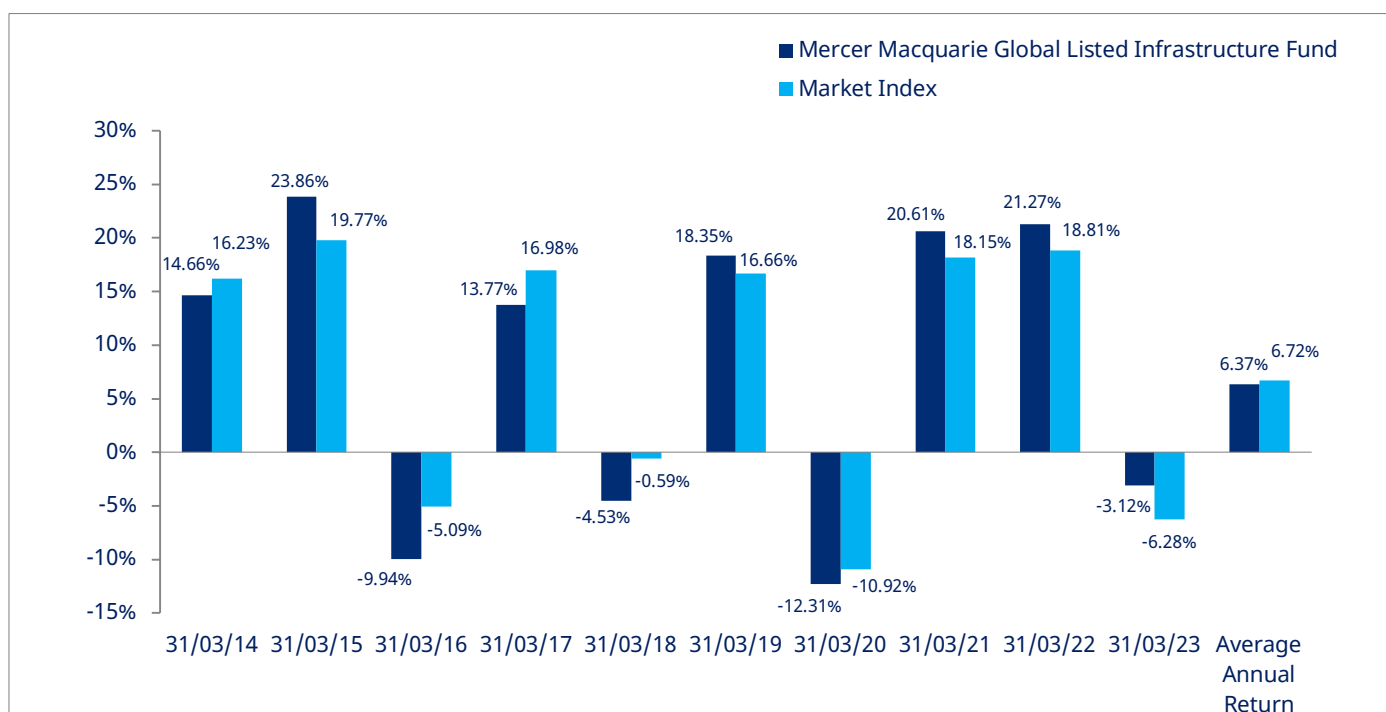

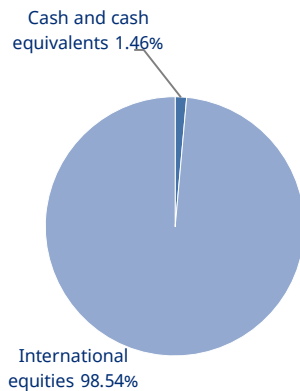
Example of how this applies to an investor

Ben had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Ben received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$3.00 (that is 0.03% of his initial \$10,000). Ben also paid \$0.00 in other charges. This gives Ben a total return after tax of \$3.00 for the year.

What does the fund invest in?

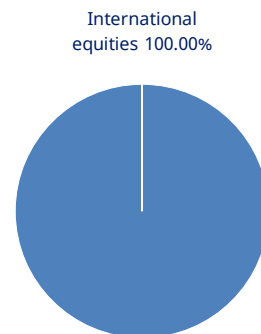
Actual investment mix

Currency management

The fund targets a position of being fully hedged to the New Zealand dollar with the hedges based on the currency weights of the underlying index. Currency hedges are normally rebalanced monthly but may be adjusted intra-month for significant cash flows. Hedging coverage, on a net of tax basis, for the Fund's exposure to foreign currency as at 30 September 2023 was 103.36%.
